

USPBC Members Hosts Polish President Andrzej Duda on the sidelines of UNGA

(New York, NY) On September 19th, the U.S.-Poland Business Council hosted a roundtable dinner discussion with the Polish President, Andrzej Duda, at the Yale Club of New York City. President Duda engaged in a high level discussion with senior American corporate executives on his priorities in Poland and ways to continue to grow the economic relationship between the United States and Poland.

The President stated that the security of the Polish people and raising the standard of living as his top priorities during his administration. He reemphasized Poland's strong commitment to NATO and to developing a strong security infrastructure. He also noted the government's continued support of the Transatlantic Trade and Investment Partnership (TTIP).

Company representatives reiterated their commitment to strengthening the Polish economy. They asked how the US business community can help with Poland's economic plan and contribute to the social welfare plan of the country. Topics of discussion included Poland's startup culture, security, and the government's human capital plan and vocational training. USPBC President Eric Stewart stated the Council's intention to play an active role in helping promote Poland as a top destination for American companies and aiding Polish companies in finding success here in the United States.
